Prof Neil Hanley

Neil Hanley is a Professor of Medicine, Consultant Endocrinologist and Director of the Fellowship Academy at the University of Manchester. He has held doctoral, intermediate and now a Wellcome Trust Senior Clinical Fellowship and has sat on the NIHR, the Wellcome Trust, the Research Council of Norway and MRC fellowship awarding panels.



Dr Elinor Shuttleworth

Elinor Shuttleworth is a specialist trainee in Gastroenterology and General Internal Medicine. She is a Wellcome Trust Clinical Research Training Fellow, and was also offered a CRTF by the Medical Research Council. She is currently studying for a PhD in Immunology, based at the Manchester Collaborative Centre for Inflammation Research (MCCIR).



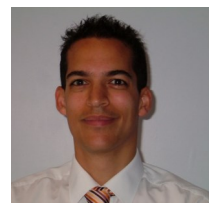
Dr Louise Wan

Louise Wan is a Wellcome Trust Clinical Research Fellow and a specialty trainee in Obstetrics & Gynaecology. As an ST1-3 trainee, she held an NIHR Academic Clinical Fellowship and was awarded a Wellbeing of Women Entry-level Research Scholarship.



Dr Will Dixon

Will Dixon is Director of the Arthritis Research UK Centre for Epidemiology, a Theme Lead in the Health eResearch Centre and an Honorary Consultant Rheumatologist at Salford Royal. He completed his PhD in 2008, was appointed to an NIHR Clinical Lectureship and, following a year in Montreal, was awarded an MRC Clinician Scientist Fellowship in 2010.



Dr Jenny Myers

Dr Jenny Myers is a Clinical Senior Lecturer based in the Institute of Human Development. She completed her PhD in 2005 and received the William Blair Bell Lectureship in 2009, awarded by the RCOG for outstanding contribution to research in the field of Obstetrics. In 2012 Dr Myers gained an NIHR Clinician Scientist Award in 2012.



Prof Paul Bishop

Prof Bishop is an ophthalmologist and clinician scientist based in the Institute of Human Development. From 1991-2006 he held successive Wellcome Trust Clinical Fellowships including a Vision Research Training Fellowship, a Clinician Scientist Fellowship and a Senior Clinical Fellowship; he was appointed to a personal Chair in 2006. He is currently Co-Director of the Centre for Advanced Discovery and Experimental Therapeutics (CADET).
